

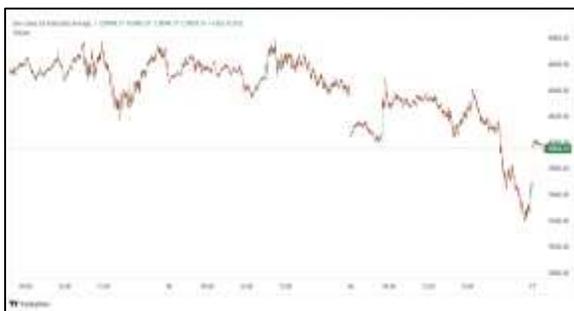

## US Stock Market

The S&P 500 and the Nasdaq rose solidly after a shaky start on Monday, as technology stocks found their footing following last week's AI-sparked selloff, while investors waited for key economic data that could shed light on the Federal Reserve's interest-rate path.

While the Dow notched its second closing record in a row with a small gain, the S&P 500 ultimately finished short of its closing record.

After surpassing 50,000 points for the first time on Friday, the Dow Jones Industrial Average (.DJI), rose 20.20 points, or 0.04%, to 50,135.87. The S&P 500 (.SPX), gained 32.52 points, or 0.47%, to 6,964.82 and the Nasdaq Composite (.IXIC), gained 207.46 points, or 0.90%, to 23,238.67.

Advancing issues outnumbered decliners by a 2.13-to-1 ratio on the NYSE where there were 789 new highs and 99 new lows. On the Nasdaq, 2,887 stocks rose and 1,917 fell as advancing issues outnumbered decliners by a 1.51-to-1 ratio.

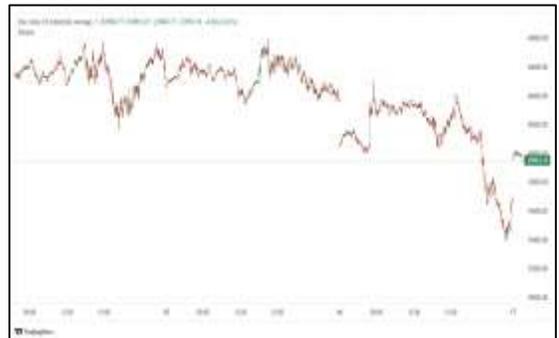
The S&P 500 posted 63 new 52-week highs and 20 new lows while the Nasdaq Composite recorded 165 new highs and 127 new lows.

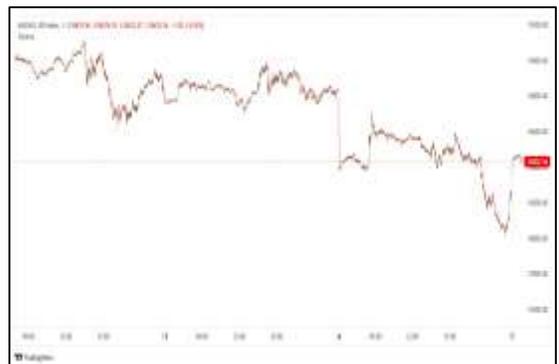

## Dow Jones Industrial Average

At the close in NYSE, the Dow Jones Industrial Average rose 0.04% to hit a new all time high. The best performers of the session on the Dow Jones Industrial Average were Microsoft Corporation (NASDAQ:MSFT), which rose 3.13% or 12.58 points to trade at 413.60 at the close. Meanwhile, NVIDIA Corporation (NASDAQ:NVDA) added 2.50% or 4.63 points to end at 190.04 and Cisco Systems Inc (NASDAQ:CSCO) was up 2.31% or 1.96 points to 86.78 in late trade.



The worst performers of the session were Merck & Company Inc (NYSE:MRK), which fell 3.51% or 4.28 points to trade at 117.65 at the close. Travelers Companies (NYSE:TRV) declined 2.88% or 8.67 points to end at 292.82 and Nike Inc (NYSE:NKE) was down 2.38% or 1.52 points to 62.40.



## NASDAQ 100

At the close in NYSE, the NASDAQ Composite index gained 0.90%. The top performers on the NASDAQ Composite were Urban-Gro Inc (NASDAQ:UGRO) which rose 2,302.60% to 3.70, Focus Universal Inc (NASDAQ:FCUV) which was up 811.81% to settle at 6.10 and CCH Holdings Ltd (NASDAQ:CCHH) which gained 140.45% to close at 1.38.



The worst performers were ScanTech AI Systems Inc (NASDAQ:STAI) which was down 39.59% to 0.90 in late trade, Polaryx Therapeutics Inc (NASDAQ:PLYX) which lost 33.45% to settle at 5.93 and Actelis Networks Inc (NASDAQ:ASNS) which was down 31.40% to 0.31 at the close.

## OIL

Oil prices eased slightly on Tuesday as traders gauged the potential for supply disruptions after U.S. guidance for vessels transiting the Strait of Hormuz kept attention squarely on tensions between Washington and Tehran.

Brent crude oil futures were down 18 cents, or 0.26%, at \$68.85 a barrel by 0353 GMT. U.S. West Texas Intermediate crude fell 21 cents, or 0.33%, to \$64.15.



## Precious and Base Metals

Gold fell on Tuesday, though held above the \$5,000-per-ounce level, as investors stayed cautious ahead of key U.S. jobs and inflation data due later this week that would provide cues to the U.S. Federal Reserve's interest rate trajectory.

Spot gold fell 0.7% to \$5,029.49 per ounce by 0332 GMT. The metal gained 2% on Monday, as the dollar weakened to a more than one-week low. It had scaled a record high of \$5,594.82 per ounce on January 29. U.S. gold futures for April delivery lost 0.5% to \$5,052.0 per ounce.

Spot silver was down 2.1% at \$81.64/oz, after rising nearly 7% in the previous session. It had hit an all-time high of \$121.64 on January 29.

Spot platinum shed 2.1% to \$2,084.09 per ounce, while palladium lost 1.7% to \$1,710.75.



## Traditional Agricultures

Soybeans posted Monday gains of 3 to 5 cents. The cmdtyView national average Cash Bean price was down 4 ¼ cents at \$10.45 1/2.

Corn futures settled the Monday session with contracts down 1 to 2 cents at the close. The CmdtyView national average Cash Corn price was down 1 1/2 cents at \$3.95 1/4.

The wheat complex closed Monday with weakness across most contracts, as spring wheat tried to hold up. Chicago SRW futures were fractionally to a penny lower on the day. KC HRW futures were down 1 to 3 cents in most contracts. MPLS spring wheat was fractionally higher to 2 cents lower at the close.
